Dear Supporters:

Your generous contributions enabled us to deliver three additional Mobile Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratories (MVDLs) to Armenia in 2016. The effort was well received by both the Ministries of Agriculture and Territorial Administration, as well as by dairy farmers alike.

Our first MVDL was delivered in 2015. The laboratory gives veterinarians the means to provide on-farm and on-site services to dairymen – previously not available. The equipment helps track and prevent health-threatening diseases and the loss of animals.

In 2016, we placed three MVDLs along Armenia's borders -- one each in Shirak and Lori, in the North, adjacent to Turkey and Georgia. In the South, we placed the third unit in Goris, near the Iranian border.

In 2017, our goal is to supply Armenia with three additional MVDLs. We would like to place one in the Lake Sevan basin of Armenia; a second one in Artsakh and the third, in Javaghk, in the Republic of Georgia. The three locations were chosen to monitor the cross-border grazing of cattle and, also, to minimize the spread of animal borne diseases such as foot-and-mouth disease.

The three units will cost \$45,000. This total amount will include the assembly and transportation, as well as the training of local veterinarians in the uses and benefits of the equipment. Our ultimate objective is to facilitate wholesome food, free of transmissible diseases.

Your voluntary tax-deductible contributions will launch the second phase of this extremely worthwhile -- indeed, essential – responsibility.

In 2016 we Prepared, Demonstrated, Trained, and Placed MVDLs in Gyumri, Vanadzor, and Goris!

We are reaching out to you, our supporters, to help us cover the second phase of this vitally important task. Our objective is to supply Armenia, Artsakh and Javaghk with total of 10 M.V.D.L.s. So far, we have already delivered four units and need six additional ones to complete this vital mission. With each unit, we provide the necessary technical lab-tech training for 4-6 end-users in each marze. Our goal is to develop base-line diagnostic information and clinical data — to include parasitology, immunology, infectious diseases, feed analysis and other disciplines that will provide long-term value to the appropriate government departments responsible for sanitation, epidemiology and public health.
